

MEMBER Maj Joe SPOTLIGHT Saenz



Maj Saenz graduated from Kilgore High School in Kilgore, Texas and enlisted in the Marine Corps in July of 1998. Following graduation from Recruit Training at MCRD San Diego, he attended MOS school to become a 2111 (Small Arms Repairman).

Upon graduating MOS School, Maj Saenz was assigned to 2nd Tank Battalion for service as the Charlie company armorer. He was promoted to corporal in November 2001 and was assigned as the Armory NCOIC for HQBN, 2nd Marine Division. Shortly after being promoted to Sergeant in July 2002 he received orders to 3rd Battalion, 8th Marines as the Armory Chief. Maj Saenz deployed with Combined Joint Task Force-Haiti in 2004, participating in Operation Secure Tomorrow.

Upon returning from Haiti, he was selected for Staff Sergeant and was ordered to MCAGCC Twen-



tynine Palms as the Armory Chief for 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines in December 2004. In January 2005, he deployed to Fallujah with 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines under Regimental Combat Team 8 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In October 2007, Maj Saenz received orders to Marine Corps Embassy Security Group where he served as the Ordnance Chief, SACO, Chief Trainer for MC-MAP and Logistics Chief. While at MCESG, Maj Saenz was selected for the Warrant Officer Program and was appointed in February 2009.

Following TBS, Maj Saenz was assigned to 1st Maintenance Battalion where he served as the Platoon Commander for a short period of time before being transferred to MARSOC West in June of 2010. In October 2010 he was promoted to

Chief Warrant Officer 2, and during this tour he served as the Ordnance Officer for 1st Marine Special Operations Battalion and 1st Marine Special Operations Support Battalion, Marine Special Operations Support Group, while the organization went through a reorganization phase. During this tour, Maj Saenz deployed to Afghanistan in 2012 under Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force -Afghanistan where he served as the first Marine to be the Maintenance Operations Officer for a Special Operations Task Force. In February 2013, Maj Saenz became the Regimental Ordnance Officer for 5th Marine Regiment until being selected for the Limited Duty Officer program and being promoted in June 2014.

MARINES PARTICIPATE IN MARINE CORPS COMBAT READINESS EVALUATION



From 5 to 11 April 2022, Ordnance Maintenance Company, 3rd Maintenance Battalion, participated in the 2022 Marine Corps Combat Readiness Evaluation (MCCRE). A combination of 137 Marines and sailors of various Military specialty occupations endured 6 days in a field environment. The Company and the battalion were evaluated on Field Level Maintenance Operations for A, B, D, and E TAMCN equipment, Command and Control, Maintenance Management, and Recovery Operations. They were also evaluated on their ability to provide forces for internal security and react to Chemical Biological Radioactive Nuclear attacks.

Headquarters, Materiel Control Section and the Intermediate Supply Activity led by Major Beck 0402, CWO2 Castilla 2120, 1stSgt De Anda 8999 and MSgt Fortenberry 2181 worked hand in hand with the battalions Maintenance Operations Section in order to C2 all Field Level maintenance operations and IX block SECREP and consumable management in support of III Marine Expeditionary Forces.

Ordnance Repair Platoon led by WO Norton 2125 and MSgt Echavez 2181 established a field intermediate armory where they issued and recovered weapons in support of the security details for Maintenance Support Teams. Additionally, ORP conducted a plethora of corrective



and preventive maintenance on weapons optics and fire control systems. The use of the sections Maintenance Shelters was key to their success during the exercise. During the 6 day exercise and 24 hour operations, ORP was able to conduct repairs on 112 weapons and optics.

Additionally, Motor Transport Maintenance Platoon North and Engineer Repair Platoon led by WO Mendoza 3510 and CWO2 Buford 2110 conducted various MSTs throughout the MEFs Area of Operations. MTM-N conducted field level maintenance and recovery operations. The Engineer platoon performed repairs and preventive maintenance on Engineer Heavy equipment and utilities. Furthermore, they supported the Expeditionary Operations Training Group with water born vehicle mechanics.

Armament Repair Platoon led by CWO2 Buford and MSgt Carleo 2149 conducted field level maintenance on M777 Howitzers.

Additionally, the section conducted MSTs to support 4th Marine Regiment with ground Ordnance vehicle maintenance at their AAV and LAV ramp. During the evaluation, ARP focused on completing their annual T&R training re-


quirements ensuring their maintainers are well prepared for the execution of the maintenance battle rhythm.

In this picture (third from top) we can see a Marine from Ground Electronics Maintenance platoon North conduct intermediate level maintenance on a radio in MOPP level 4 after a notional CBRN attack on the OMC compound. GEM-N works hand in hand with the Battalion's Reparable Issue Point for the repairs of all A TAMCN secondary reparable items and seamless transition back to the customer. The GEM-N section is also a calibrations induction point for the Northern Camps of Okinawa. GEM-N is led by CWO2 Zemcik 2805 and GySgt Bolio 2862.

End of Mission! The MCCRE evaluation was an overall success for the battalion.

The sections within the company received nothing but noteworthy results for their performance.

In order to realign with the 2030 force Design, Ordnance Maintenance Company is in transition to becoming a Regional Maintenance Operations Company (RMOC) but it will always remain in the hearts or the Ground Ordnance Community as 3rd OMC.

The following was received from Ordnance Marines:


Dennis Adams: Joe was a quiet man and a gentleman in all respects. I often stopped by the Infantry Weapons Shop when I was in the

His standard of work was nothing less than excellence and he accepted nothing less. He was especially effective with training the young Marines and they looked up to him with the greatest of respect. The Marine Corps was truly blessed to have him work with us for all those years.

Joe and I remained friends after his retirement and we communicated often even after he moved

SELF MEMBERSHIP FORM

Membership Levels: There are various membership levels and options which are open to Marines currently serving, or having formerly honorably served, in the active or reserve components of the United States Marine Corps; who have been awarded a ground ordnance maintenance Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) by competent authority in accordance with Marine Corps directives in effect at the time of their service, and have honorably served as a Ground Ordnance Maintenance Marine.

In addition, there are also Associate Member options that open to all members of any USMC MOS, U.S. Military Service, or family members of an active GOMA member.

Lifetime (\$225.00) or Lifetime Associate (\$225.00) Lifetime membership is a one-time cost with no further dues ever needed. Over the years as costs rise, so will dues. This one time designation is currently being offered as a great value.

1 year (\$30.00); 2 years (\$55.00); 3 years (75.00): These options are for both regular and associate members

Recruitment Incentive: Any active member who recruits two new members in any given year will be given a one year gift membership that can be used either for their own annual membership or to be used as a gift membership to another person of their choice.
